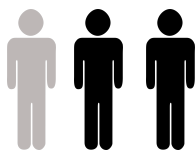


Opioids: What You Need to Know

WHAT ARE OPIOIDS?

Opioids are a family of highly addictive drugs used to treat pain.

Opioids include:

- Fentanyl
- Heroin
- Morphine
- Codeine
- Oxycodone
- Hydrocodone
- Tramadol
- Meperidine

192 people died **every day** from **drug overdoses** in **2017**

THE OPIOID CRISIS AT A GLANCE

Every hour in 2015...



76 people were treated in and released from an emergency department for opioid-related care.

+144% SINCE 2006



92 people were admitted to an inpatient hospital for opioid-related care.

+64% SINCE 2006

Call 911 Right Away if you see any of these Overdose signs:

- Face is very pale, clammy to the touch
- Body is limp, can't wake
- Lips or fingernails appear blue
- Person is vomiting or gurgling
- Breathing or heartbeat is very slow

Faces of Addiction

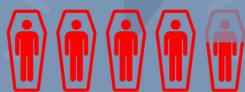

Addiction can happen to anyone, but help is available!

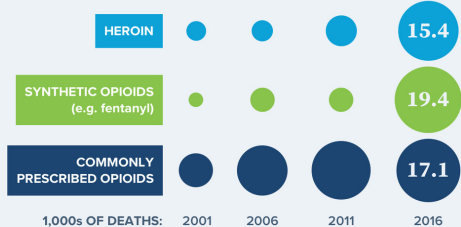


Overdoses can be reversed if 911 is called!

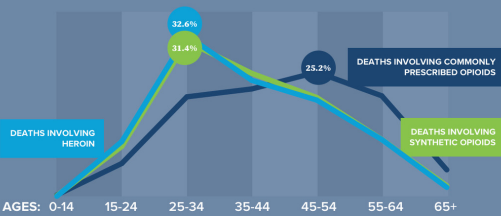


4.6 overdose deaths every hour in 2016
