



- Heroin
- Morphine
- Codeine
- Oxycodone
- Hydrocodone
- Tramadol
- Meperidine

Faces of Addiction



Addiction can happen to anyone, but help is available!

192 people died every day from drug overdoses **in 2017**

Call 911 Right Away if you see any of these **Overdose signs:**

- Face is very pale, clammy to the touch
- · Body is limp, can't wake
- Lips or fingernails appear blue
- · Person is vomiting or gurgling
- Breathing or heartbeat is very slow



Overdoses can be reversed if 911 is called!
